

Admission Application Check List

A completed application submitted to the School Office initiates the admission process. To be complete, the application should include:

Non-refundable Registration Fee **Personal Testimonies of Parents/Guardians**
(For each student seeking admission)

Family Application Most Recent **Report Card**
(Signed by Parents/Guardians)

Student Application Form **Academic Transcript** (Grades 6-12)
(One for each student seeking admission)

MS/HS Student Information/Agreement Form Most recent **Standardized Test scores**
(One for each student entering grades 6-12)

New Student Reference Form **Immunization Record**
(To be completed by former teacher; one for each
Student making application)

Pastor's Recommendation Form **Tuition Assistance Application**
(if applicable register through fax FACTS))

Upon receipt of all completed application materials, an admissions testing date is assigned for the student(s). After testing is completed, family interviews are set up for each family.

Admissions Testing:

After all materials have been submitted, you will receive a contact from school personnel to schedule a time for student testing by a classroom teacher from your child's grade group. The testing will be given to assess your child's reading, writing, and math skills at his/her appropriate grade level. The time to complete the testing will depend on your child's abilities but on average should take no longer than approximately 60 minutes.

Family Interviews:

A private family interview will be scheduled between the family and the Admissions Committee; children applying to enter grades 5-12 are asked to accompany their parents to the interview.

Notification of Decisions:

After interviewing the family, your family will receive notification of the decision regarding admission to Juniata Mennonite School through written notification.

Acceptance of Enrollment is based on:

Completion and submission of above documents with satisfactory recommendations

Satisfactory performance on grade-level testing

Parents' and students' commitment to support school policies as stated in the handbook which includes:

JMS discretion for the grade placement of students

Agreement to fulfill tuition and other financial obligations

Providing an atmosphere and conduct at home that supports Biblical lifestyles and moral principles of the school
